

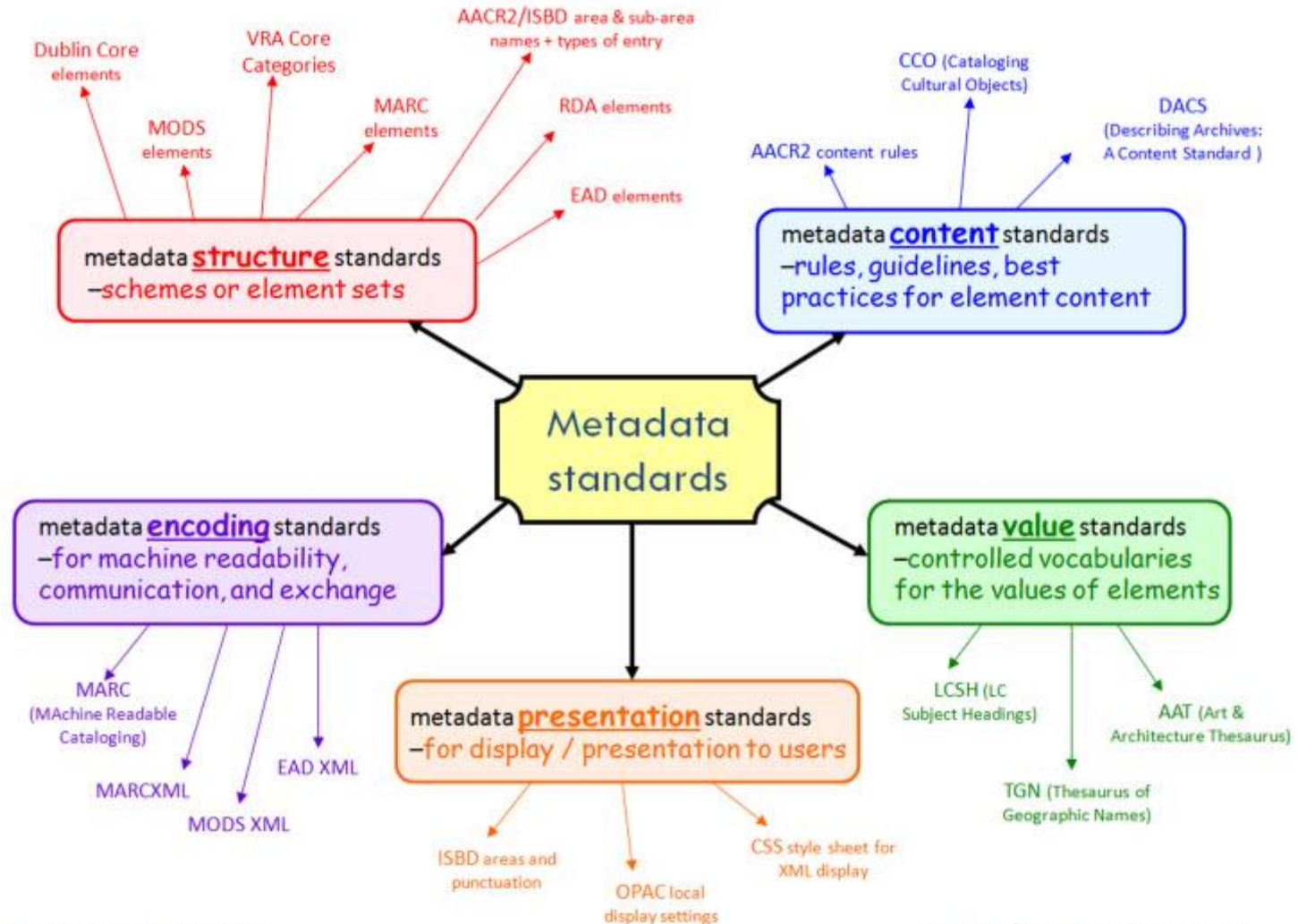

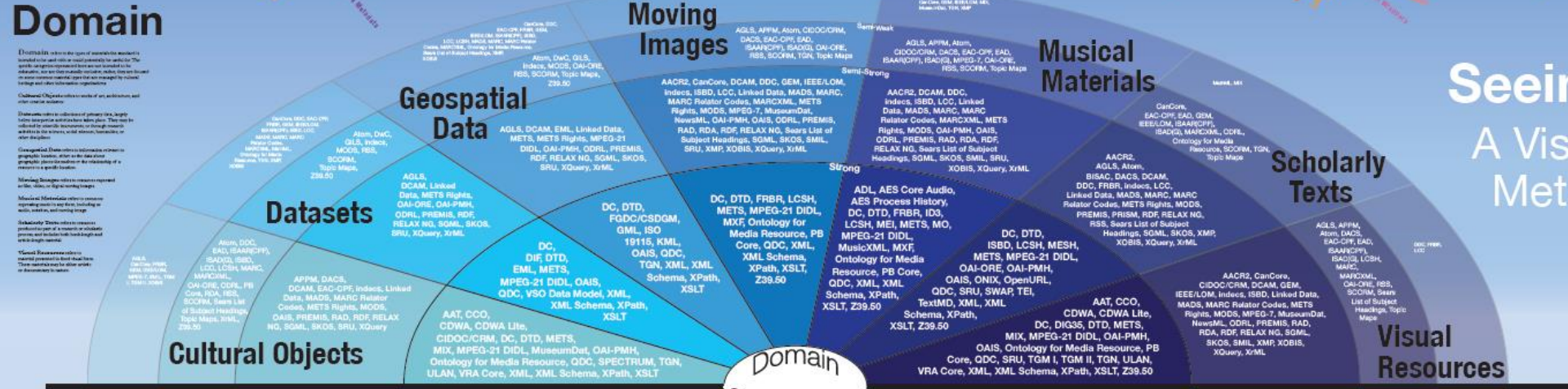
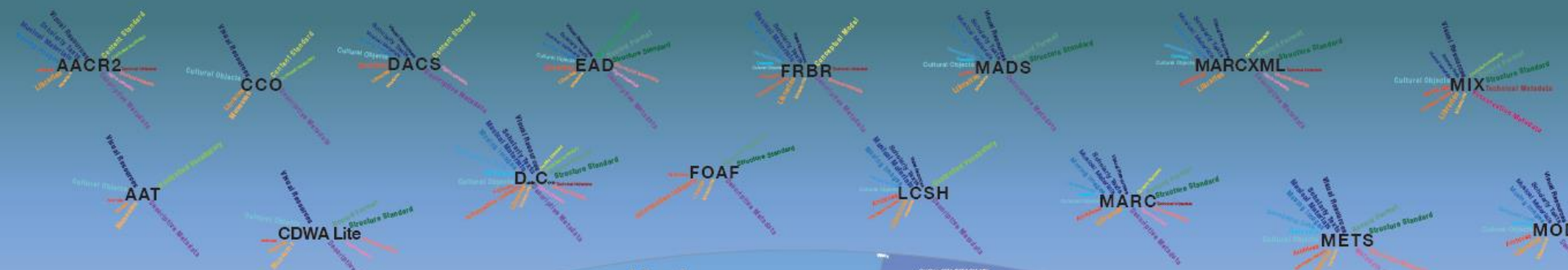

Metadata → bibliographic data is one kind

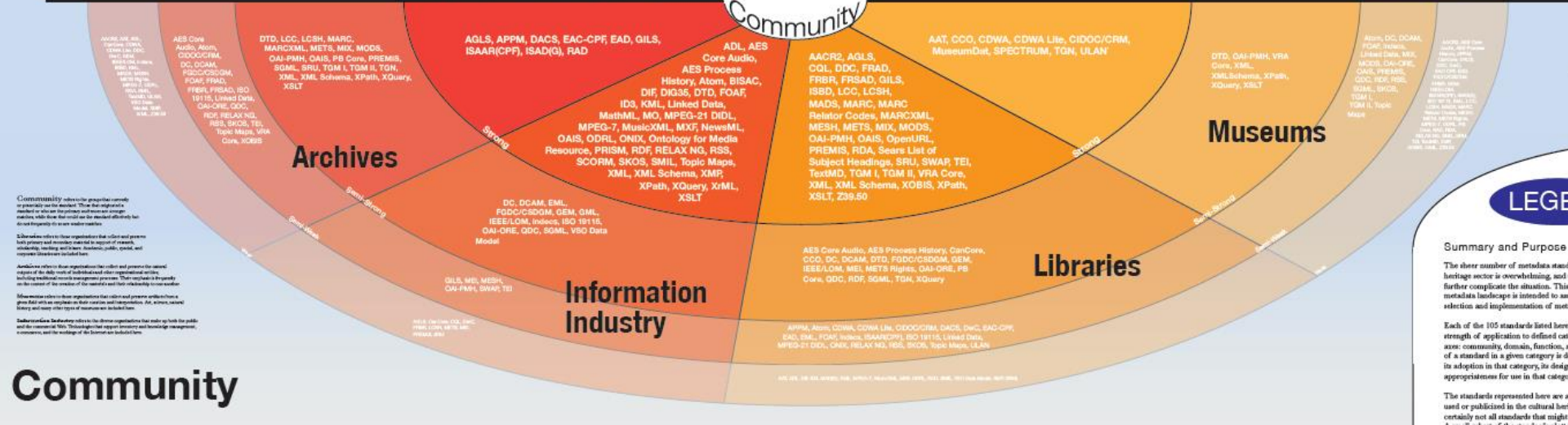


**Domain**

Domain refers to the specific area of knowledge or activity that a metadata standard is designed to describe. The domain is indicated by the color of the segment in the sunburst chart. The domain is also indicated by the color of the text in the sunburst chart.

**Summary and Purpose**

The sheer number of metadata standards in the heritage sector is overwhelming, and further complicates the situation. This metadata lexicon is intended to assist in the selection and implementation of metadata standards.

Each of the 105 standards listed here have a strength of application to defined categories: community, domain, function, or of a standard in a given category is indicated by its adoption in that category, its design appropriateness for use in that category.

The standards represented here are not intended or published in the cultural heritage sector, but they are certainly not all standards that might be used or published in the cultural heritage sector.
